DISCUSSION ITEMS

Economic Development Tools- City

Mr. Burkett stated the City has been exploring economic development tools to stay competitive in the region when it comes to attracting new businesses and retaining existing businesses. He explained what the Community Reinvestment Area Program is, the benefits, and a few potential targeted areas.

Police/School Partnerships- City

Chief Evers stated their mission statement is one that talks about working in partnership with the community, and one of their most valued partnerships is with the schools. He discussed the School Resource Officer in the middle and high schools, the DARE program, and the school visits that occurred last year. Chief Evers explained several personnel changes that were going to take place this school year.

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Mark Brown, new hired Community Engagement Officer, spoke about the duties of his new job and how he planned to still be involved with the schools.

Road Projects- City

Mr. Moorman discussed several road projects that are planned for this fall and next spring.

Beavercreek City Schools 2018-2019 School Year- School

Mr. Otten said a school levy will be on the November ballot. He discussed the school's strategy plan process which included financial stability, student success, communication, and operations of the school district. Mr. Otten stated the operations includes growth and enrollment, a master facility plan, and redistricting.

Roundtable Discussion- City/School

There was a discussion about the school joining our fuel center, and seeing if the City Manager and the Superintendent would discuss that further. Each member of City Council and the School Board was given the opportunity to speak. Several comments were made regarding the partnership between the two entities and how much it is appreciated.


ADJOURNMENT
