The Beavercreek Police Department is bringing Safety Town back to the community!

Safety Town is a week-long interactive and educational experience for children **entering kindergarten and first grade in the Beavercreek City School District.** Beavercreek police officers and guest speakers will provide age appropriate instruction in various topics including traffic safety, pedestrian and bike safety, fire safety, poison prevention, stranger awareness, Internet safety, school and bus safety, 911 usage, emergency preparedness, and gun safety. Children will also be able to enjoy our miniature town and “drive” around the streets and walk along the sidewalks with cross walks, stop signs and real working traffic signals.

Safety Town 2019 will be held in two sessions:

Session 1 runs from June 3-7 and Session 2 runs from June 10-14.

Hours are 9:00 AM – 11:00 AM at Shaw Elementary School at 3560 Kemp Road.
